One main focus of the Institute for Economics and Law is economic policy and European law. The EU-Team offers corresponding expertise in the field of international transfer of technologies and knowledge.

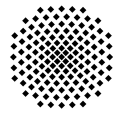

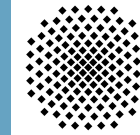
